SECTION A: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE COLLEGE AND SUMMARY EVALUATION

Purpose and scope of the inspection:

Inspection by the SIS is designed to strengthen the quality of education on offer to international students through Tier 4 of the points-based system for student visas. Inspection provides objective and reliable reports on the quality of colleges, and by placing reports in the public domain, makes this information available to students, the UK Border Agency and the wider community. Inspection takes account of the context of each individual college, and of how it evaluates its own performance and demonstrates its success. Reports help colleges, their staff, and governors and proprietors to recognise and build on their strengths and to identify and remedy their weaknesses. Reports also address the issues relating to the safeguarding, welfare, health and safety of students including, where applicable, those under eighteen and vulnerable adults. This inspection was an interim visit in order to monitor progress.

Characteristics of the college:

The Maria Montessori Institute (MMI) is situated in the West End of London. It offers a number of courses awarded by the Association Montessori Internationale (AMI) which has its head office in Amsterdam. The principal course for the purpose of this inspection and Tier 4, is the course in Montessori education of children aged three to six years in affiliation with AMI. The course is currently being offered on a one or two year basis according to the individual students' needs. Four students taking the AMI course in Montessori education of children aged three to six years are currently taking the course over a two year period to meet their individual needs. The Institute also offers a part-time diploma course in the education of children aged from six to twelve years, an AMI Montessori Assistants to Infancy course, an AMI Montessori Assistants Certificate, an internally awarded Post-Diploma Observation Course, and works in collaboration with AMI to offer the AMI Trainer of Trainers programme. The college has provision located at five different sites which offer opportunities for teaching practice. The current student body on the Tier 4 course are from within the EU, and also from outside the EU, coming from Kenya, Mexico, Tanzania, Indonesia, India and Singapore.

The Institute is still situated on two campuses, though the location for teaching has changed since the previous inspection. It retains its Tier 4 and highly trusted status. The main administrative centre continues to be in Hampstead, North London with the main training centre now in refurbished accommodation in West London. The move to West London is recent. Refurbishment of the premises has been to a high standard and provides teaching spaces that are appropriate to training students using Montessori methods. There have been no changes to the management structure of the college since the last inspection. There are currently eight Tier 4 students attending the main course.

Summary evaluation of the college:

The college continues to maintain the high standards of educational provision for its students described by the last full inspection and report. Students say that they enjoy the course and that they find it both interesting and challenging. This was confirmed by both the demonstration and practice sessions attended during the inspection. Students confirm that they feel that they are making progress and that

the college provides them with good support at personal, academic and practical levels. They emphasise the frequency of discussions and feedback provided by their tutors; in particular they say that assessment and guidance provided is well matched to their previous experiences and personal needs, including experience of higher education. This confirms the information contained in the college's detailed and thoughtfully maintained assessment records. Teaching is enhanced by the high quality of accommodation provided and resources available to support training.

The college shows good knowledge of the procedures required by the Home Office and maintenance of Tier 4 status. They understand the use of CAS. Courses are reviewed each year to ensure that the needs of each intake of students are met through the methodology used to convey the Montessori course content. The college keeps thorough details of its courses and assessment procedures. The admissions register provides a helpful and ready check on all aspects of student information, including in relation to nationality, passport and visas, as well as contact details. Attendance is regularly checked and suitable records maintained. Students understand clearly that ninety per cent attendance is an essential prerequisite for sitting for the diploma examinations at the end of the course. An appropriate range of information is provided to prospective students prior to enrolment, including details of requirements relating to competency in English.
